

# Acts 25

1 Now <sup>G3767</sup> when Festus <sup>G5347</sup> was come <sup>G1910</sup> into the province <sup>G1885</sup>, after <sup>G3326</sup> three <sup>G5140</sup> days <sup>G2250</sup> he ascended <sup>G305</sup> from <sup>G575</sup> Caesarea <sup>G2542</sup> to <sup>G1519</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2414</sup>. 2 Then <sup>G1161</sup> the high priest <sup>G749</sup> and <sup>G2532</sup> the chief <sup>G4413</sup> of the Jews <sup>G2453</sup> informed <sup>G1718</sup> him <sup>G846</sup> against <sup>G2596</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup>, and <sup>G2532</sup> besought <sup>G3870</sup> him <sup>G846</sup>, 3 And desired <sup>G154</sup> favour <sup>G5485</sup> against <sup>G2596</sup> him <sup>G846</sup>, that <sup>G3704</sup> he would send for <sup>G3343</sup> him <sup>G846</sup> to <sup>G1519</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2419</sup>, laying <sup>G4160</sup> wait <sup>G1747</sup> in <sup>G2596</sup> the way <sup>G3598</sup> to kill <sup>G337</sup> him <sup>G846</sup>. 4 But <sup>G3303</sup> Festus <sup>G3767</sup> answered <sup>G5347</sup>, that Paul <sup>G3972</sup> should be kept <sup>G5083</sup> at <sup>G1722</sup> Caesarea <sup>G2542</sup>, and <sup>G1161</sup> that he himself <sup>G1438</sup> would <sup>G3195</sup> depart <sup>G1607</sup> <sup>G1722</sup> shortly <sup>G5034</sup> thither. 5 Let them therefore <sup>G3767</sup>, said <sup>G5346</sup> he, which among <sup>G1722</sup> you <sup>G5213</sup> are able <sup>G1415</sup>, go down with <sup>G4782</sup> me, and accuse <sup>G2723</sup> this <sup>G846</sup> man <sup>G435</sup>, if <sup>G1536</sup> there be <sup>G2076</sup> any wickedness <sup>G1536</sup> in <sup>G1722</sup> him <sup>G5129</sup>. 6 And <sup>G1161</sup> when he had tarried <sup>G1304</sup> among <sup>G1722</sup> them <sup>G846</sup> more <sup>G4119</sup> than <sup>G2228</sup> ten <sup>G1176</sup> days <sup>G2250</sup>, he went down <sup>G2597</sup> unto <sup>G1519</sup> Caesarea <sup>G2542</sup>, and the next day <sup>G1887</sup> sitting <sup>G2523</sup> on <sup>G1909</sup> the judgment seat <sup>G968</sup> commanded <sup>G2753</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup> to be brought <sup>G711</sup>. 7 And <sup>G1161</sup> when he <sup>G846</sup> was come <sup>G3854</sup>, the Jews <sup>G2453</sup> which came down <sup>G2597</sup> from <sup>G575</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2414</sup> stood round about <sup>G4026</sup>, and <sup>G2532</sup> laid <sup>G5342</sup> many <sup>G4183</sup> and grievous <sup>G926</sup> complaints <sup>G157</sup> against <sup>G2596</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup>, which <sup>G3739</sup> they could <sup>G2480</sup> not <sup>G3756</sup> prove <sup>G584</sup>. 8 While he answered <sup>G626</sup> for himself <sup>G846</sup>, Neither <sup>G3754</sup> against <sup>G3777</sup> the law <sup>G1519</sup> of the Jews <sup>G2453</sup>, neither <sup>G3777</sup> against <sup>G1519</sup> the temple <sup>G2411</sup>, nor yet <sup>G3777</sup> against <sup>G1519</sup> Caesar <sup>G2541</sup>, have I offended <sup>G264</sup> any thing at all <sup>G5100</sup>. 9 But <sup>G1161</sup> Festus <sup>G5347</sup>, willing <sup>G2309</sup> to do <sup>G2698</sup> the Jews <sup>G2453</sup> a pleasure <sup>G5485</sup>, answered <sup>G611</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup>, and said <sup>G2036</sup>, Wilt thou <sup>G2309</sup> go up <sup>G305</sup> to <sup>G1519</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2414</sup>, and there <sup>G1563</sup> be judged <sup>G2919</sup> of <sup>G4012</sup> these things <sup>G5130</sup> before <sup>G1909</sup> me <sup>G1700</sup>? 10 Then <sup>G1161</sup> said <sup>G2036</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup>, I stand <sup>G1510</sup> at <sup>G2476</sup> Caesar's <sup>G2541</sup> judgment seat <sup>G968</sup>, where <sup>G3757</sup> I ought <sup>G1163</sup> to be judged <sup>G2919</sup>: to the Jews <sup>G2453</sup> have I done <sup>G91</sup> no <sup>G3762</sup> wrong <sup>G91</sup>, as <sup>G5613</sup> thou <sup>G2532</sup> very well <sup>G2566</sup> knowest <sup>G1921</sup>. 11 For <sup>G1063</sup> if <sup>G1487</sup> I be an offender <sup>G91</sup>, or <sup>G2532</sup> have committed <sup>G4238</sup> any thing <sup>G5100</sup> worthy <sup>G514</sup> of death <sup>G2288</sup>, I refuse <sup>G3868</sup> not <sup>G3756</sup> to die <sup>G599</sup>: but <sup>G1161</sup> if <sup>G1487</sup> there be <sup>G2076</sup> none <sup>G3762</sup> of these things <sup>G3739</sup> whereof these <sup>G3778</sup> accuse <sup>G2723</sup> me <sup>G3450</sup>, no man <sup>G3762</sup> may <sup>G1410</sup> deliver <sup>G5483</sup> me <sup>G3165</sup> unto them <sup>G846</sup>. I appeal unto <sup>G1941</sup> Caesar <sup>G2541</sup>. 12 Then <sup>G5119</sup> Festus <sup>G5347</sup>, when he had conferred <sup>G4814</sup> with <sup>G3326</sup> the council <sup>G4824</sup>, answered <sup>G611</sup>, Hast thou appealed unto <sup>G1941</sup> Caesar <sup>G2541</sup>? unto <sup>G1909</sup> Caesar <sup>G2541</sup> shalt thou go <sup>G4198</sup>.

13 And <sup>G1161</sup> after <sup>G1230</sup> certain <sup>G5100</sup> days <sup>G2250</sup> king <sup>G935</sup> Agrippa <sup>G67</sup> and <sup>G2532</sup> Bernice <sup>G959</sup> came <sup>G2658</sup> unto <sup>G1519</sup> Caesarea <sup>G2542</sup> to salute <sup>G782</sup> Festus <sup>G5347</sup>. 14 And <sup>G1161</sup> when <sup>G5613</sup> they had been <sup>G1304</sup> there <sup>G1563</sup> many <sup>G4119</sup> days <sup>G2250</sup>, Festus <sup>G5347</sup> declared <sup>G394</sup> Paul's <sup>G3972</sup> cause <sup>G2596</sup> unto the king <sup>G935</sup>, saying <sup>G3004</sup>, There is <sup>G2076</sup> a certain <sup>G5100</sup> man <sup>G435</sup> left <sup>G2641</sup> in bonds <sup>G1198</sup> by <sup>G5259</sup> Felix <sup>G5344</sup>: 15 About <sup>G4012</sup> whom <sup>G3739</sup>, when <sup>G1096</sup> I was <sup>G1096</sup> at <sup>G1519</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2414</sup>, the chief priests <sup>G749</sup> and <sup>G2532</sup> the elders <sup>G4245</sup> of the Jews <sup>G2453</sup> informed <sup>G1718</sup> me, desiring <sup>G154</sup> to have judgment <sup>G1349</sup> against <sup>G2596</sup> him <sup>G846</sup>. 16 To <sup>G4314</sup> whom <sup>G3739</sup> I answered <sup>G611</sup>, It is <sup>G2076</sup> not <sup>G3756</sup> the manner <sup>G1485</sup> of the Romans <sup>G4514</sup> to deliver <sup>G5483</sup> any <sup>G5100</sup> man <sup>G444</sup> to <sup>G1519</sup> die <sup>G684</sup>, before <sup>G4250</sup> that <sup>G2228</sup> he which is accused <sup>G2723</sup> have <sup>G2192</sup> the accusers <sup>G2725</sup> face to face <sup>G2596</sup> <sup>G4383</sup> <sup>G5037</sup>, and have <sup>G2983</sup> licence <sup>G5117</sup> to answer for himself <sup>G627</sup> concerning <sup>G4012</sup> the crime laid against him <sup>G1462</sup>. 17 Therefore <sup>G3767</sup>, when they <sup>G846</sup> were come <sup>G4905</sup> hither <sup>G1759</sup>, without <sup>G4160</sup> any <sup>G3367</sup> delay <sup>G311</sup> on the morrow <sup>G1836</sup> I sat <sup>G2523</sup> on <sup>G1909</sup> the judgment seat <sup>G968</sup>, and commanded <sup>G2753</sup> the man <sup>G435</sup> to be brought forth <sup>G71</sup>. 18 Against <sup>G4012</sup> whom <sup>G3739</sup> when the accusers <sup>G2725</sup> stood up <sup>G2476</sup>, they brought <sup>G2018</sup> none <sup>G3762</sup> accusation <sup>G156</sup> of such things as <sup>G3739</sup> <sup>G1473</sup> supposed <sup>G5282</sup>: 19 But <sup>G1161</sup> had <sup>G2192</sup> certain <sup>G5100</sup> questions <sup>G2213</sup> against <sup>G4314</sup> him <sup>G846</sup> of <sup>G4012</sup> their own <sup>G2398</sup> superstition <sup>G1175</sup>, and <sup>G2532</sup> of <sup>G4012</sup> one <sup>G5100</sup> Jesus <sup>G2424</sup>, which was dead <sup>G2348</sup>, whom <sup>G3739</sup> Paul <sup>G3972</sup> affirmed <sup>G5335</sup> to be alive <sup>G2198</sup>. 20 And <sup>G1161</sup> because I <sup>G1473</sup> doubted <sup>G639</sup> of <sup>G1519</sup> such <sup>G5127</sup> manner <sup>G4012</sup> of questions <sup>G2214</sup>, I asked <sup>G3004</sup> him whether <sup>G1487</sup> he would <sup>G1014</sup> go <sup>G4198</sup> to <sup>G1519</sup> Jerusalem <sup>G2419</sup>, and there <sup>G2546</sup> be judged <sup>G2919</sup> of <sup>G4012</sup> these matters <sup>G5130</sup>. 21 But <sup>G1161</sup> when Paul <sup>G3972</sup> had appealed <sup>G1941</sup> to be reserved <sup>G5083</sup> <sup>G846</sup> unto <sup>G1519</sup> the hearing <sup>G1233</sup> of Augustus <sup>G4575</sup>, I commanded <sup>G2753</sup> him <sup>G846</sup> to be kept <sup>G5083</sup> till <sup>G2193</sup> I might send <sup>G3992</sup> him <sup>G846</sup> to <sup>G4314</sup> Caesar <sup>G2541</sup>. 22 Then <sup>G1161</sup> Agrippa <sup>G67</sup> said <sup>G5346</sup> unto <sup>G4314</sup> Festus <sup>G5347</sup>, I would <sup>G1014</sup> also <sup>G2532</sup> hear <sup>G191</sup> the man <sup>G444</sup> myself <sup>G846</sup>. To

morrow<sup>G839 G1161</sup>, said<sup>G5346</sup> he, thou shalt hear<sup>G191</sup> him<sup>G846</sup>. **23** And on the morrow<sup>G1887</sup>, when<sup>G3767</sup> Agrippa<sup>G67</sup> was  
 come<sup>G2064</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> Bernice<sup>G959</sup>, with<sup>G3326</sup> great<sup>G4183</sup> pomp<sup>G5325</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> was entered<sup>G1525</sup> into<sup>G1519</sup> the place of  
 hearing<sup>G201</sup>, with<sup>G4862 G5037</sup> the chief captains<sup>G5506</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> principal<sup>G2596 G1851</sup> men<sup>G435</sup> of<sup>G5607</sup> the city<sup>G4172</sup>, at<sup>G2532</sup>  
 Festus<sup>G5347</sup> commandment<sup>G2753</sup> Paul<sup>G3972</sup> was brought forth<sup>G71</sup>. **24** And<sup>G2532</sup> Festus<sup>G5347</sup> said<sup>G5346</sup>, King<sup>G935</sup>  
 Agrippa<sup>G67</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> all<sup>G3956</sup> men<sup>G435</sup> which<sup>G3588</sup> are here present<sup>G4840</sup> with us<sup>G2254</sup>, ye see<sup>G2334</sup> this man<sup>G5126</sup>,  
 about<sup>G4012</sup> whom<sup>G3739</sup> all<sup>G3956</sup> the multitude<sup>G4128</sup> of the Jews<sup>G2453</sup> have dealt<sup>G1793</sup> with me<sup>G3427</sup>, both<sup>G5037</sup> at<sup>G1722</sup>  
 Jerusalem<sup>G2414</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> also here<sup>G1759</sup>, crying<sup>G1916</sup> that he ought<sup>G1163</sup> not<sup>G3361</sup> to live<sup>G2198</sup> any longer<sup>G3371</sup>. **25** But<sup>G1161</sup>  
 when I<sup>G1473</sup> found<sup>G2638</sup> that he<sup>G846</sup> had committed<sup>G4238</sup> nothing<sup>G3367</sup> worthy<sup>G514</sup> of death<sup>G2288</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> that he<sup>G1161</sup>  
 himself<sup>G846</sup> hath appealed<sup>G5127</sup> to<sup>G1941</sup> Augustus<sup>G4575</sup>, I have determined<sup>G2919</sup> to send<sup>G3992</sup> him<sup>G846</sup>. **26** Of<sup>G4012</sup>  
 whom<sup>G3739</sup> I have<sup>G2192</sup> no<sup>G3756</sup> certain<sup>G804</sup> thing<sup>G5100</sup> to write<sup>G1125</sup> unto my lord<sup>G2962</sup>. Wherefore<sup>G1352</sup> I have brought<sup>G4254</sup>  
 him<sup>G846</sup> forth<sup>G4254</sup> before<sup>G1909</sup> you<sup>G5216</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> specially<sup>G3122</sup> before<sup>G1909</sup> thee<sup>G4675</sup>, O king<sup>G935</sup> Agrippa<sup>G67</sup>, that<sup>G3704</sup>,  
 after examination<sup>G351</sup> had<sup>G1096</sup>, I might have<sup>G2192</sup> somewhat<sup>G5100</sup> to write<sup>G1125</sup>. **27** For<sup>G1063</sup> it seemeth<sup>G1380</sup> to me<sup>G3427</sup>  
 unreasonable<sup>G249</sup> to send<sup>G3992</sup> a prisoner<sup>G1198</sup>, and<sup>G2532</sup> not withal<sup>G3361</sup> to signify<sup>G4591</sup> the crimes<sup>G156</sup> laid against<sup>G2596</sup>  
 him<sup>G846</sup>.
