

# Job 13

1 Lo, mine eye<sup>H5869</sup> hath seen<sup>H7200</sup> all this, mine ear<sup>H241</sup> hath heard<sup>H8085</sup> and understood<sup>H995</sup> it. 2 What ye know<sup>H1847</sup>, the same do I know<sup>H3045</sup> also: I am not inferior<sup>H5307</sup> unto you. 3 Surely<sup>H199</sup> I would speak<sup>H1696</sup> to the Almighty<sup>H7706</sup>, and I desire<sup>H2654</sup> to reason<sup>H3198</sup> with God<sup>H410</sup>. 4 But<sup>H199</sup> ye are forgers<sup>H2950</sup> of lies<sup>H8267</sup>, ye are all physicians<sup>H7495</sup> of no value<sup>H457</sup>. 5 O that<sup>H5414</sup> ye would altogether<sup>H2790</sup> hold your peace<sup>H2790</sup>! and it should be your wisdom<sup>H2451</sup>. 6 Hear<sup>H8085</sup> now my reasoning<sup>H8433</sup>, and hearken<sup>H7181</sup> to the pleadings<sup>H7379</sup> of my lips<sup>H8193</sup>. 7 Will ye speak<sup>H1696</sup> wickedly<sup>H5766</sup> for God<sup>H410</sup>? and talk<sup>H1696</sup> deceitfully<sup>H7423</sup> for him? 8 Will ye accept<sup>H5375</sup> his person<sup>H6440</sup>? will ye contend<sup>H7378</sup> for God<sup>H410</sup>? 9 Is it good<sup>H2895</sup> that he should search you out<sup>H2713</sup>? or as one man<sup>H582</sup> mocketh<sup>H2048</sup> another, do ye so mock<sup>H2048</sup> him? 10 He will surely<sup>H3198</sup> reprove<sup>H3198</sup> you, if ye do secretly<sup>H5643</sup> accept<sup>H5375</sup> persons<sup>H6440</sup>. 11 Shall not his excellency<sup>H7613</sup> make you afraid<sup>H1204</sup>? and his dread<sup>H6343</sup> fall<sup>H5307</sup> upon you? 12 Your remembrances<sup>H2146</sup> are like<sup>H4912</sup> unto ashes<sup>H665</sup>, your bodies<sup>H1354</sup> to bodies<sup>H1354</sup> of clay<sup>H2563</sup>.

13 Hold your peace<sup>H2790</sup>, let me alone, that I may speak<sup>H1696</sup>, and let come<sup>H5674</sup> on me what will.<sup>1</sup> 14 Wherefore do I take<sup>H5375</sup> my flesh<sup>H1320</sup> in my teeth<sup>H8127</sup>, and put<sup>H7760</sup> my life<sup>H5315</sup> in mine hand<sup>H3709</sup>? 15 Though<sup>H2005</sup> he slay<sup>H6991</sup> me, yet will I trust<sup>H3176</sup> in him: but I will maintain<sup>H3198</sup> mine own ways<sup>H1870</sup> before<sup>H6440</sup> him.<sup>2</sup> 16 He also shall be my salvation<sup>H3444</sup>: for an hypocrite<sup>H2611</sup> shall not come<sup>H935</sup> before<sup>H6440</sup> him. 17 Hear<sup>H8085</sup> diligently<sup>H8085</sup> my speech<sup>H4405</sup>, and my declaration<sup>H262</sup> with your ears<sup>H241</sup>. 18 Behold now, I have ordered<sup>H6186</sup> my cause<sup>H4941</sup>; I know<sup>H3045</sup> that I shall be justified<sup>H6663</sup>. 19 Who is he that will plead<sup>H7378</sup> with me? for now, if I hold my tongue<sup>H2790</sup>, I shall give up the ghost<sup>H1478</sup>. 20 Only do<sup>H6213</sup> not two<sup>H8147</sup> things unto me: then will I not hide<sup>H5641</sup> myself from thee<sup>H6440</sup>. 21 Withdraw<sup>H7368</sup> thine hand<sup>H3709</sup> far<sup>H7368</sup> from me: and let not thy dread<sup>H367</sup> make me afraid<sup>H1204</sup>. 22 Then call<sup>H7121</sup> thou, and I will answer<sup>H6030</sup>: or let me speak<sup>H1696</sup>, and answer<sup>H7725</sup> thou me.

23 How many are mine iniquities<sup>H5771</sup> and sins<sup>H2403</sup>? make me to know<sup>H3045</sup> my transgression<sup>H6588</sup> and my sin<sup>H2403</sup>. 24 Wherefore hidest<sup>H5641</sup> thou thy face<sup>H6440</sup>, and holdest<sup>H2803</sup> me for thine enemy<sup>H341</sup>? 25 Wilt thou break<sup>H6206</sup> a leaf<sup>H5929</sup> driven to and fro<sup>H5086</sup>? and wilt thou pursue<sup>H7291</sup> the dry<sup>H3002</sup> stubble<sup>H7179</sup>? 26 For thou writest<sup>H3789</sup> bitter things<sup>H4846</sup> against me, and makest me to possess<sup>H3423</sup> the iniquities<sup>H5771</sup> of my youth<sup>H5271</sup>. 27 Thou puttest<sup>H7760</sup> my feet<sup>H7272</sup> also in the stocks<sup>H5465</sup>, and lookest narrowly<sup>H8104</sup> unto all my paths<sup>H734</sup>; thou settest a print<sup>H2707</sup> upon the heels<sup>H8328</sup> of my feet<sup>H7272</sup>.<sup>34</sup> 28 And he, as a rotten thing<sup>H7538</sup>, consumeth<sup>H1086</sup>, as a garment<sup>H899</sup> that is moth<sup>H6211</sup> eaten<sup>H398</sup>.
