1 Moreover the LORD<sup>H3068</sup> answered<sup>H6030</sup> Job<sup>H347</sup>, and said<sup>H559</sup>, 2 Shall he that contendeth<sup>H7378</sup> with the Almighty<sup>H7706</sup> instruct<sup>H3250</sup> him? he that reproveth<sup>H3198</sup> God<sup>H433</sup>, let him answer<sup>H6030</sup> it. 3 Then Job<sup>H347</sup> answered<sup>H6030</sup> the LORD<sup>H3068</sup>, and said<sup>H559</sup>, 4 Behold, I am vile<sup>H7043</sup>, what shall I answer<sup>H7725</sup> thee? I will lay<sup>H7760</sup> mine hand<sup>H3027</sup> upon<sup>H3926</sup> my mouth<sup>H6310</sup>. 5 Once<sup>H259</sup> have I spoken<sup>H1696</sup>, but I will not answer<sup>H6030</sup>: yea, twice<sup>H8147</sup>, but I will proceed no further<sup>H3254</sup>.

6 Then answered<sup>H6030</sup> the LORD<sup>H3068</sup> unto Job<sup>H347</sup> out of the whirlwind<sup>H5591</sup>, and said<sup>H559</sup>, 7 Gird up<sup>H247</sup> thy loins<sup>H2504</sup> now like a man<sup>H1397</sup>: I will demand<sup>H7592</sup> of thee, and declare<sup>H3045</sup> thou unto me. 8 Wilt thou also disannul<sup>H6565</sup> my judgment<sup>H4941</sup>? wilt thou condemn<sup>H7561</sup> me, that thou mayest be righteous<sup>H6663</sup>? 9 Hast thou an arm<sup>H2220</sup> like God<sup>H410</sup>? or canst thou thunder<sup>H7481</sup> with a voice<sup>H6963</sup> like him? 10 Deck<sup>H5710</sup> thyself now with majesty<sup>H1347</sup> and excellency<sup>H1363</sup>, and array<sup>H3847</sup> thyself with glory<sup>H1935</sup> and beauty<sup>H1926</sup>. 11 Cast abroad<sup>H6327</sup> the rage<sup>H5678</sup> of thy wrath<sup>H639</sup>: and behold<sup>H7200</sup> every one that is proud<sup>H1343</sup>, and abase<sup>H8213</sup> him. 12 Look<sup>H7200</sup> on every one that is proud<sup>H1343</sup>, and bring him low<sup>H3665</sup>; and tread down<sup>H1915</sup> the wicked<sup>H7563</sup> in their place. 13 Hide<sup>H2934</sup> them in the dust<sup>H6083</sup> together<sup>H3162</sup>, and bind<sup>H2280</sup> their faces<sup>H6440</sup> in secret<sup>H2934</sup>. 14 Then will I also confess<sup>H3034</sup> unto thee that thine own right hand<sup>H3225</sup> can save<sup>H3467</sup> thee.

15 Behold now behemoth<sup>H930</sup>, which I made<sup>H6213</sup> with thee; he eateth<sup>H398</sup> grass<sup>H2682</sup> as an ox<sup>H1241</sup>. 16 Lo now, his strength<sup>H3581</sup> is in his loins<sup>H4975</sup>, and his force<sup>H202</sup> is in the navel<sup>H8306</sup> of his belly<sup>H990</sup>. 17 He moveth<sup>H2654</sup> his tail<sup>H2180</sup> like a cedar<sup>H730</sup>: the sinews<sup>H1517</sup> of his stones<sup>H6344</sup> are wrapped together<sup>H8276</sup>. 2 18 His bones<sup>H6106</sup> are as strong<sup>H650</sup> pieces of brass<sup>H5154</sup>, his bones<sup>H1634</sup> are like bars<sup>H4300</sup> of iron<sup>H1270</sup>. 19 He is the chief<sup>H7225</sup> of the ways<sup>H1870</sup> of God<sup>H410</sup>: he that made<sup>H6213</sup> him can make<sup>H5066</sup> his sword<sup>H2719</sup> to approach<sup>H5066</sup> unto him. 20 Surely the mountains<sup>H2022</sup> bring him forth<sup>H5375</sup> food<sup>H944</sup>, where all the beasts<sup>H2416</sup> of the field<sup>H7704</sup> play<sup>H7832</sup>. 21 He lieth<sup>H7901</sup> under the shady trees<sup>H6628</sup>, in the covert<sup>H5643</sup> of the reed<sup>H7070</sup>, and fens<sup>H1207</sup>. 22 The shady trees<sup>H6628</sup> cover<sup>H5526</sup> him with their shadow<sup>H6752</sup>; the willows<sup>H6155</sup> of the brook<sup>H5158</sup> compass him about<sup>H5437</sup>. 23 Behold, he drinketh up<sup>H6231</sup> a river<sup>H5104</sup>, and hasteth<sup>H2648</sup> not: he trusteth<sup>H982</sup> that he can draw up<sup>H1518</sup> Jordan<sup>H3383</sup> into his mouth<sup>H6310</sup>. 3 24 He taketh<sup>H3947</sup> it with his eyes<sup>H5869</sup>: his nose<sup>H639</sup> pierceth through<sup>H5344</sup> snares<sup>H4170</sup>. 4
